

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT ZONE SCHEDULES

This zone schedule is being made available pursuant to 15 CFR 400.44(e), which states: “The Board shall make copies of zone schedules available on its Web site.”

Availability of this zone schedule on the FTZ Board’s website does not imply that the FTZ Board has approved any rate/charge, policy or other content of this zone schedule. In particular, while the FTZ Board staff intends to conduct spot checks over time, zone schedules are not reviewed for compliance with the public utility requirement (19 U.S.C. 81n, 15 CFR 400.42) prior to making the zone schedules available via the Board’s website.

Pursuant to 15 CFR 400.44(b)(4), a grantee may not assess any specific rate or charge for which the amount – or formula for calculating the amount – does not appear in the zone schedule that the grantee has submitted to the FTZ Board.

Complaints about a grantee’s compliance with statutory and regulatory requirements related to public utility and uniform treatment – including rate or charge amounts/formulas, a grantee assessing a rate or charge amount/formula that does not appear in its zone schedule, and a grantee not affording uniform treatment under like conditions – may be presented to the FTZ Board under 15 CFR 400.45 (which also allows for complaints to be made on a confidential basis, if necessary).

Unique Identifier

Numbers, letters, or combination of numbers and letters that identify merchandise admitted to a zone with zone status.

Act

The Foreign-Trade Zones Act of June 18, 1934 (48. State. 998-1003; 19 U.S.C. 1a-14), as amended.

Secretary

The term "Secretary" means the Secretary of Commerce.

Board

The Foreign-Trade Zone Board created by the act to carry out the provisions thereof. The Board shall consist of the Secretary of Commerce, who shall be the chairman and exclusive officer and the Secretary of the Treasury.

AICS

Alternative Inventory Control Systems—The computerized procedure to maintain the records necessary for inventory control of merchandise that is under the supervision of the U.S. Customs & Border Protection.

SUBRULE 200

Issued: 1/1/07

Application of Rates:

Effective: 1/1/07

Rates, rules, and regulations published in this tariff will apply at Foreign-Trade Zone No. 173, Port of Grays Harbor, Aberdeen, Washington. Except as otherwise provided in individual subrules, this tariff is to be applied to cargo or merchandise specifically destined into Foreign-Trade Zone 173 and subject as such to handling, storage, and administrative charges as provided for in this tariff.

The Grantee shall (be the sole judge to) interpret and determine the applicability of any of the rates, rules and regulations or services provided for in this Tariff. However, any matter involving interpretation or action by U.S. Customs & Border Protection or other agency of the U.S. Government will be determined by the Port Director of Customs or his duly appointed representative.

SUBRULE 205

Issued: 7/26/95

Use, Deemed Acceptance:

Effective: 7/26/95

The use of the Zone shall be deemed complete acceptance of this tariff and the terms and conditions named herein.

SUBRULE 210

Admittance to the Zone:

SUBRULE 215

Issued: 7/26/95

Enforcement of Charges:

Effective: 7/26/95

For the purpose of enforcing the payment of charges named in this tariff on merchandise handled, stored, or manipulated on the Zone facilities, the Zone may take possession of such merchandise, and may remove and store same at the charge, risk, and expense of the owner or consignee thereof and or may sell the goods by public auction, and or pursue such other remedies as may be provided by law.

The Zone reserves the right to withhold delivery of merchandise on which charges are unpaid.

SUBRULE 220

When Charges Payable:

Charges are due and payable as they accrue. The Port may require the payment of charges accrued against the merchandise before withdrawal of such cargo.

Compliance with Laws:

Users shall comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations.

SUBRULE 230

General Rules and Regulations:

Except as otherwise provided in this tariff, all general rules, regulations, terminal rates and charges published in the Port of Grays Harbor Tariff No. 1, supplements or revisions thereto or reissues thereof, will apply.

SUBRULE 235

Hours of Business:

Business to be transacted within the Zone is confined to the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, Federal, State, ILWU, and Port holidays excepted. The Zone is available to Users by appointment only telephone (360) 533-9528. If the use of the Zone at other times is permitted, overtime provisions of Subrule 315 will apply.

SUBRULE 240

Insurance:

The Port shall not be responsible for insuring merchandise in the Zone.

SUBRULE 245

Liability of Others:

If and when other companies are permitted to perform services at the Zone, they shall be held responsible for loss, damage, or theft by themselves or persons in their employ and liable for the injury of persons in their employ, except to the extent that any such injury results from negligent acts or omissions of the Port, its employees, or agents.

In the event of injury or damage to equipment of persons, User agrees to present to the Port for the Port's inspection and examination the damaged equipment; all those persons employed by User with knowledge of the injury or damage; and all reports made by, on behalf of, or in the possession of User respecting the injury or damage. Failure to provide the Port, at the Port's request, timely access to equipment, information, or employees, shall constitute an admission by User that it is at fault.



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RULES AND REGULATIONS

SUBRULE 250

Perishable Goods:

Perishable goods, or goods which are susceptible to damage through temperature changes or other causes incidental to general storage, are accepted in general storage only at User's risk for such damages as might result from general storage conditions.

SUBRULE 255

Public Interest, Health, or Safety:

No operation or process or treatment will be permitted in the Zone that, in the sole judgment of the Port, is detrimental to the public interest, health, or safety.

SUBRULE 260

Responsibility for Loss, Damage, and Delay of Merchandise:

Responsibility

The Port will not be responsible for any loss, damage, or delay of merchandise which may arise from any cause beyond its direct authority and control, nor from any cause except for want of due diligence.

Further, the Port shall not be liable for any loss, damage or delay of merchandise, or any other injury which results from animals, insects, rodents or vermin; nor from decay, deterioration, evaporation, shrinkage or loss of quantity, quality, or value from inherent vice of product; nor from fire, frost, leakage or discharge from fire protective sprinklers, oxidation or rusting; nor from civil disorder, insurrection, riot, strike or labor stoppage whether or not agents or the employees of the terminals be involved; nor from delay caused by shortage of qualified labor.

In performing the services of receiving and delivery, the Port will accept no responsibility for concealed damage nor the condition of contents of containers, whether or not receipt issued so state.

User, renter or operator, including but not limited to equipment, shall indemnify and save harmless the Port from and against all liability, losses, claims, demands, and suits from damages, including death and personal injury, and including costs of suits and attorney's fees, incident to or resulting from its operation at the Port.

SUBRULE 265

Removal of Trash and Garbage:

Manufacturers of merchandise within the Zone shall not be allowed to accumulate trash or garbage, which, in the opinion of the Port, constitutes a health or fire menace. The Zone will, with or without notice to User, arrange removal of such trash or garbage, and shall assess the account of the cargo or merchandise originating such trash or garbage all costs of cleaning and removal.

SUBRULE 270

Admissions:

The User will provide a signed CBP FORM 214 and required support documents on zone status merchandise stored under FTZ supervision and control.

SUBRULE 275

Manipulations:

The Zone User will provide a signed CBP FORM 216 and 216A application and permit for the manipulation, manufacture, exhibition, or destruction of foreign-trade zone merchandise and Customs officer's return.

SUBRULE 280

Space Assignment:

Assignment of space within the Zone for the manipulation of cargo shall be made as follows:

Subject to need and availability, manipulation areas will be assigned by the Zone upon request.

Such assigned areas shall be in effect commencing with the date granted by the Zone, and may be revoked on thirty (30) days written notice by either party.

Users will be required to pay the cost of any special alterations for the installation of machinery and equipment.

If electricity is used as part of the manufacturing operation, a separate meter may be installed. The User will be responsible for the utility charges and the cost of the meter installation.

Regular assigned manipulation areas shall be for the exclusive use of the User.

SUBRULE 285

Zone Regulations:

General rules and regulations in this section governing procedure within Foreign-Trade Zone No. 173 are issued in conformity with and supplementary to the Foreign-Trade Zones Board's and U.S. Customs & Border Protection's regulations and such of the United States laws and regulation relating to ports of entry as are applicable to Foreign-Trade Zone operations.

All operators and users of FTZ 173 must comply with federal regulation that govern foreign-trade zones, including those of Foreign-Trade Zone Board (15 CFR part 400) and those of U.S. Customs & Border Protection (19 CFR Part 146), in addition to complying with all other federal, state and local regulations and laws. Users of this schedule are responsible for obtaining the most current regulations.

SUBRULE 300

Issued: 7/26/95

Administrative/Storage Fees:

Effective: 7/26/95

Administrative/storage fees (Subrule 305) will be assessed on the first day of each month. The use of foreign-trade zone during any part of the month will cause liability for a full month's administrative/storage fee. Administrative fees include: inventory reports, statistical reports, document duplication, and special projects. Storage fees include the use of land and will be assigned different values by the type of land and area they are located in.

Rates are in dollars and cents, per hour and per man.

Rates apply for work performed for vessels, their owners, or operators and for all first, second, third shift and overtime work performed by the Port.

“Straight Time” and “Overtime” shall be construed as applied in labor contracts or collective bargaining agreements applicable at the Port.

If penalty wages are incurred in connection with “Penalty Cargoes”, as construed under working agreements effective at the Port, such Penalty Wage payment, plus 50% additional, will be charged in addition to all other charges applicable under this Subrule.

The difference between wages at the scale for Overtime, and those at the scale for basic Straight Time shall be known as Overtime Wage Differentials.

When the Port is required to furnish labor for a specific service, and such service is completed before the expiration of the minimum time allowed under labor’s working agreements and awards, the parties authorizing such work shall be assessed the full cost of labor, including the actual wage paid labor plus all assessments, insurance costs, and taxes for the time which accrues after the specified service is completed and until the end of the minimum time allowed.

Standby time occurs when the Port is required to order labor for a specific service and for a stated time and, through no fault or inability of the Port, the service cannot be started or when services in progress are delayed. Full cost of labor, to include actual wages plus assessments, insurance, and taxes for the time lost shall be assessed.

When the Port is required to travel longshoremen, foremen, checkers, or other labor, the full cost of travel time, including any wage, assessment, insurance, and tax costs plus fares, mileage, and subsistence, will be assessed the user of the involved service.
